

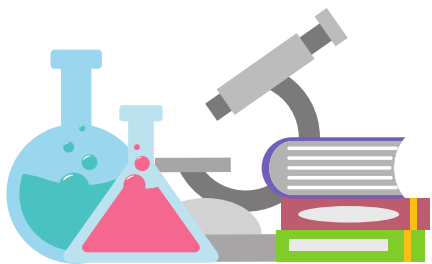
## Year 6 Humanism

They believe science provides the answers to some of life's 'big questions'.

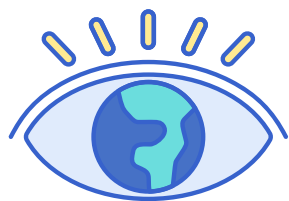


Humanists believe humans should take responsibility for our actions and do not need 'spiritual rules' to guide us to right and wrong.

### Rites of passage

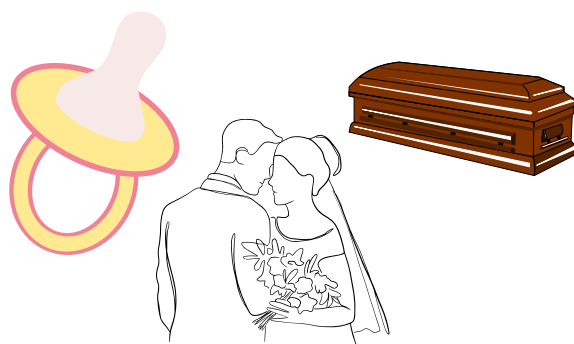

There are now Humanists celebrants who can help with new baby celebrations, weddings and funerals.



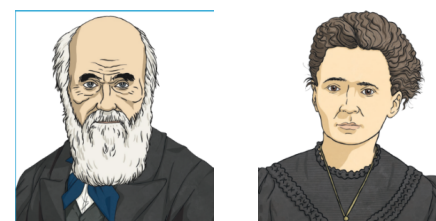
### Influential and Humanist thinkers
